





HISTORY OF THE NBC

World Series Origin

The National Baseball Congress World Series was first played in 1935. However, the idea came about a few years prior when Wichita sporting goods salesman, Hap Dumont, formed the idea of creating a National Baseball Congress State Tournament. The idea was conceived after watching a Sunday baseball game between circus clowns and local firemen.

Island Park stood in the middle of the Arkansas River, which was where the first tournament was played in 1931. After making a few bucks on the event, Dumont expanded it over the next few years, until a cigarette was left in the bleachers, burning it to the ground.

Following the accident, Dumont formulated the idea that if the city of Wichita would build a new stadium, he would host a national semi-pro tournament, hoping to draw teams from coast to coast. The city built the stadium on the west bank just south of the old park and named it after Wichita pioneer Robert Lawrence.

Satchel Paige was considered the greatest pitcher of that era and in 1935, Dumont offered him an impressive sum of \$1,000 to bring his touring team from Bismarck, N.D., to compete in the first NBC tournament. Dumont did not have the money when he made the offer, but he believed he would make it at the gate.

Paige's pitching prowess proved to be true as he struck out 60 batters and won four games—a record that still stands today. Dumont ended up making enough money to pay Paige, as well as all of the bills.

The tournament was a huge success from the beginning.



The Sporting News, baseball's Bible of the day, gave the event significant coverage. Thus, the national tournament was born.

Thousands of young prospects and ex-major leaguers have played in the tournament, which is still held in the stadium Hap helped build. In the first few decades, most of the teams were either barnstorming semi-pro clubs or town teams sponsored by local factories. The typical star was an ex-professional, and many of the players had also played major league ball.

As a result of Hap's success over the last 82 years, the NBC has helped produce over 800 professional players. The tournament has become a widespread tradition within the city of Wichita, gaining popularity across the country.

2016 GRADUATE OF THE YEAR

Ian Kinsler is known as one of the best second basemen in Major League Baseball. Not a lot of second basemen in the MLB are known as power hitters, but Kinsler has provided some significant pop during his career. Even though he only stands 6'0" 200 pounds in the batter's box, he eclipsed the 200 home-run mark in 2016, joining an elite group. An All-Star talented second baseman like Kinsler doesn't just supply a powerful bat; however, he also provides a reliable glove in the field.

The NBC World Series Graduate of the Year Award is based on the previous season statistics. The GOY must have played in the NBC World Series or played on an NBC affiliated team. Kinsler was a member of the Liberal, KS Bee Jays in 2001, and helped lead them to a seventh place finish in the NBC World Series. Kinsler played in 49 of 54 games with the Liberal Bee Jays and batted .280, driving in 20 RBI's and leading the team with 60 total bases. He scored 29 runs on 11 doubles with 3 stolen bases. He also walked 12 times and slugged .357.

While playing second base with the Detroit Tigers, Kinsler hit a .296 average with 185 hits, 11 homeruns and 73 RBI's in 2015. "I would like to thank the National Baseball Congress for selecting me as the 2016 Graduate of the Year," Kinsler said. "I just want to thank everybody and I hope everyone has a good time at the tournament."

Kinsler was not offered a Division I scholarship out of high school but that didn't stop him from pursuing his dreams. He decided to play at Central Arizona College in 2001 and was named second team All-Arizona Community College Athletic Conference (ACCAC). Ian racked up a .405 batting average with three home runs, 39 RBI's, 17 doubles and 24 stolen bases while leading Central Arizona College to a league title.

After a year at Central Arizona College, Kinsler transferred to Arizona State covering the middle of the infield with current Red Sox second baseman, Dustin Pedroia. In 2002, Kinsler transferred to the University of Missouri and was named All-Big 12 Conference second team and led all hitters with a .619 average in the Fall World Series.

Missouri's Tim Jamison had high praise for Kinsler.7 NBC WORLD SERIES 2016



"From the moment he walked through the doors here, you could tell he was on a mission," Jamison said.

The Texas Rangers drafted Kinsler in the 17th round as the 496th overall selection of the MLB Draft. In April of 2006, Kinsler made his major league debut at second base against the Boston Red Sox at Globe Life Park in Arlington, Texas. He batted .286 with 14 homeruns and 55 RBIs in his first year as a Ranger. Kinsler led the Rangers to back-toback World Series appearances in 2010 and 2011 against the San Francisco Giants and the St. Louis Cardinals. The Rangers eventually traded Kinsler during the 2013 offseason to the Detroit Tigers.

During his 10-year career as a big leaguer, Kinsler has appeared in four All-Star Games while being a premier second baseman for the Texas Rangers and the Detroit Tigers. Kinsler was named the Wilson Defensive Player of the Year in 2014 with the Detroit Tigers while playing in 160 games in a 162 game season. In 2016, Kinsler became only the third active major league player to record 200 home runs, 1,000 runs scored, 1,600 hits and 200 stolen bases.

The Graduate of the Year Award has been awarded to former NBC greats since 1975 and past award recipients include: Albert Pujols, Paul Goldschmidt, Alex Gordon, Mark Texeira, Dave Winfield and Joe Carter. We are proud to announce Ian Kinsler as our 2016 Graduate of the Year Award winner.

ALVIN "BOOMER" JONES – SEGUIN, TX

Alvin "Boomer" Jones was a coach and player for the SMI Seguin (TX) Steelers of the Zaragoza League from 1978 to 2003. He was a hardhitting first baseman and DH who loved competing for an opportunity to travel to Wichita for a shot at a world series title. Seguin's best finish in the NBC was fifth place in 1986. Jones won the Individual Sportsmanship award as a manager during the 1994 NBC World Series.


In 2003, while battling cancer, Jones made arrangements with his doctor to fly back and forth from Wichita to Seguin to get treatment while the NBC World Series was in progress. This was the last year Boomer traveled to Wichita, as he passed away from colon cancer in 2004. Prior to coaching and playing for Seguin, Jones was a player in the Atlanta Braves organization until 1975. He also scouted for the Braves after his playing career ended.



CLYDE GIRRENS – WICHITA, KS

As a catcher, Clyde Girrens played in his first NBC Kansas State Tournament when he was only 15 years old. He signed with the Los Angeles Dodgers in 1950 and played for five years in their organization. In 1959, Girrens was back in Wichita, playing for the Wichita Weller Indians. That year, he was named to his first of four All-American teams—a record at the time (1959, 1960, 1964, 1965). Also, Girrens was named Most Valuable Player of the 1959 NBC World Series.

During his NBC World Series career, Girrens played in 22 games, scoring 18 times, and recording 31 hits, four homeruns, five stolen bases and collecting 21 runs-batted-in with a .392 batting average. Girrens is also an inductee of the Kansas Baseball Hall of Fame.





KEN MARLER – POPLAR BLUFF, MO

Known as a dangerous hitter who almost never struck out, Ken Marler began his NBC World Series career in 1965 with the Liberal Bee Jays. Each of Marler's six summers spent playing in the NBC World Series were with the Liberal Bee Jays except in 1966 when he was a left fielder for the Wichita, KS Dreamliners. Ken's years with the Bee Jays were spent as a right fielder. Marler was an All-American in 1968 as the Liberal Bee Jays won their first of five national championships.

While Marler played for Liberal, the Bee Jays finished in second place in 1965 and 1969. Marler had an eye-popping NBC career, playing in 37 games, while recording 38 runs, 60 hits, 9 homeruns, 28 runs-batted-in and an impeccable batting average of .384. Marler passed away in June 2015.

TAYLOR THOMPSON – SEATTLE, WA

Taylor Thompson started his NBC World Series career in 2006 with the Seattle Studs. Between 2006 & 2015, Thompson compiled a 7-2 record and 14 saves in 45 appearances. He pitched in 100.2 innings, allowing 60 hits and striking 85 batters, while only walking 26. Most incredible is his 0.85 earned run average of allowing just 8 earned runs.

On top of his dominating numbers, Taylor is just the second player in NBC history to be named to the NBC All-American Team four times (2008, 2010, 2013, and 2014). Thompson also helped lead the Studs to two NBC World Series championships (2013 & 2015), and four NBC World Series runner-up finishes in 2008, 2010, 2012 and 2014.





AUGIE GARRIDO – AUSTIN, TX

Before he became the winningest coach in NCAA Division I baseball history with 1,975 victories, Augie Garrido spent four straight summers in Alaska with the Anchorage Glacier Pilots. He was the Pilots assistant coach in 1973 and 1974, leading them to a third place finish both years at the NBC World Series.

The following two years, Garrido served as the team's manager. He led them to another third place finish in 1975. Garrido guided the Pilots to the championship game in 1976; however, they had to settle for second place after losing to the Goldpanners. His college coaching resumé is remarkable, having earned five national titles and six National Coach of the Year honors. Garrido coached at San Francisco State, Cal-Poly, Cal-State Fullerton, Illinois and Texas during his 48-year coaching career. He led teams to 15 College World Series appearances, 33 NCAA Regional appearances and 25 conference championships.
